Success criteria

- Outstanding school provision for meeting the needs of children affected by attachment/early childhood trauma
- School skilled to lead attachment training in other settings as part of its NSS role
- Effective TA support (inc 1:1) leading academic support and interventions for LAC
- SEMH needs of LAC pupils are met, such that confidence, self esteem and engagement in learning is promoted
- Full participation of LAC in curriculum enrichment experiences and in any chosen extra-curricular activity
- EHCP successfully awarded
- All LAC have full access to learning

Impact

- **Achieve** All pupils make substantial and sustained progress across the curriculum, developing excellent knowledge, understanding and skills
- **Achieve** The progress across the curriculum of disadvantaged pupils, disabled pupils and those with special educational needs matches or is improving towards that of other pupils with the same starting points.

Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. Schools are accountable for the allocation and reporting of these funds.

Grendon CE Primary School's 2015-16 Pupil Premium allocation = £10300

Pupil Premium expenditure 2015-16

- SENCO role allocated to Pupil Premium to lead interventions for LAC pupils (1/2 day per week)
- Increased Teaching Assistant support in Key Stage 1 class
- Provision of full time 1:1 Teaching Assistant
- Personal ICT device
- Professional services eg; Educational Psychologist, Occupational Therapist
- Curriculum enrichment eg; school visits, extra curricular clubs and residential trips

Impact on standards

100% of Key Stage 1 pupils attained at least the expected level for their age in reading, writing and maths
100% of Key Stage 2 pupils met or exceeded expected levels of progress in reading, writing and maths
All pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium funding made at least expected progress in all curriculum areas
