



Roadworks are starting in your area soon

What's happening, where and when?

What: Highway improvement works - We will be installing an asphalt footway from Sweetacre Close to Easton Way to link up the existing footways, which will provide a safer route for pedestrians.

Where: Yardley Road and Easton Way, Grendon.

When: Monday 24 April to Tuesday 9 May 2023

How long: 10 working days (excluding bank holidays)

Traffic Management: Yardley Road will be closed to through traffic from Sweetacre Close to Easton Way for the works duration, 24 hours a day. A diversion route will be always in place during the works, as shown on the map overleaf. The **red** line shows the road closure extents, and the **blue** line shows the diversion route.

In addition to the closure there will be two-way traffic lights on Easton Way, to allow us to work safely and keep the traffic flowing.

Emergency Vehicles: will need to follow the diversion to access Easton Way, from Yardley Road

Access and Egress Residents and Through Traffic: Should not be affected. However, there will be no access to Yardley Road between Sweetacre Close and Easton Way.

Pedestrian: Access will be maintained when safe to do so.

Public Transport: Bus route VH1 may be affected by this closure. Please contact the service provider for any change to service:

Parking: To help us with our work, please move any vehicles parked within this section of the road. This is to enable our workforce to be able to carry out the works swiftly, without delay. We also ask that you park leaving a minimum of 20 metres of any junction throughout the duration of the works. Thank you for your understanding, patience and co-operation.



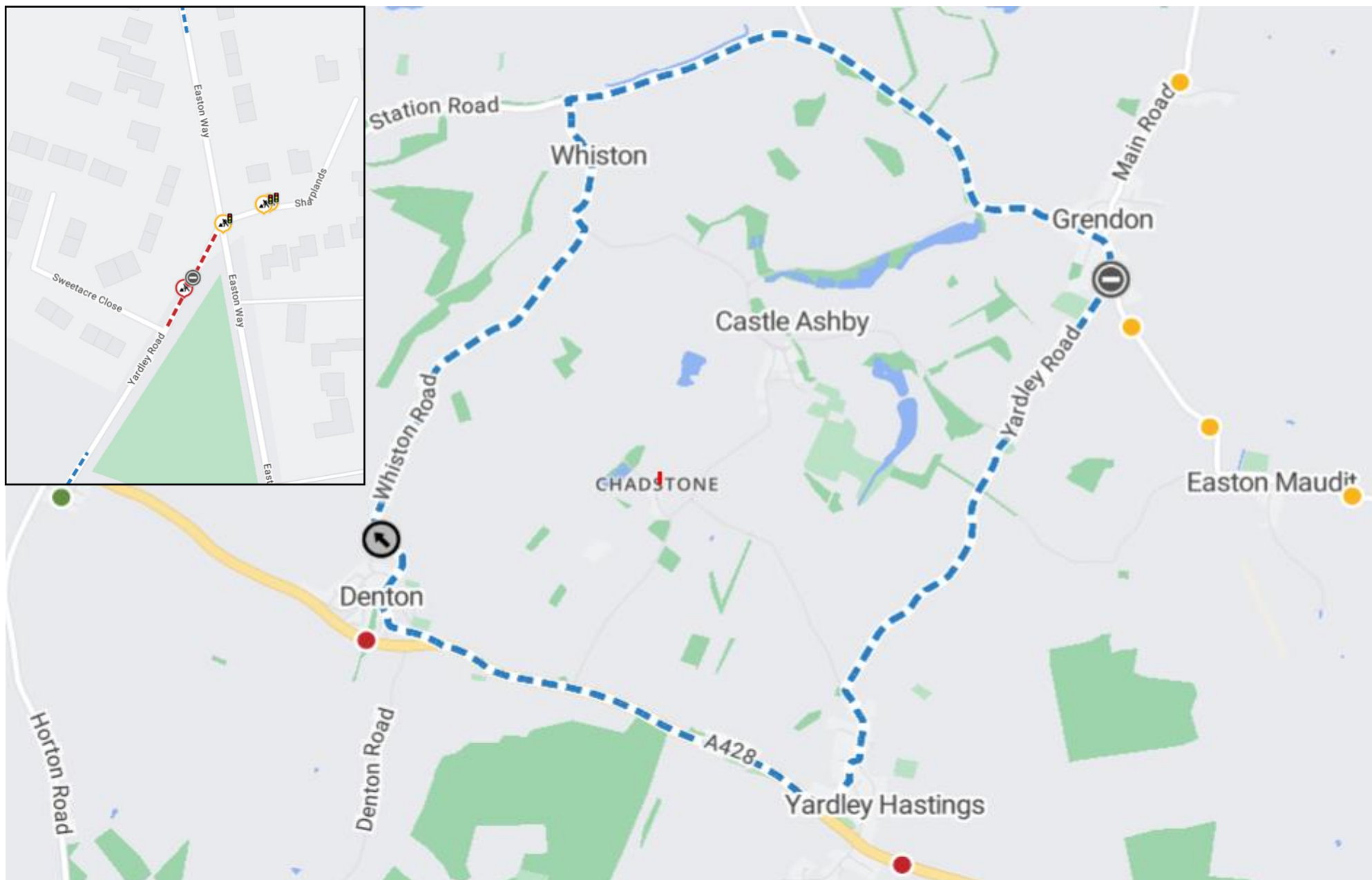
