

Covid-19 Risk Assessment for Grendon CE Primary School

This risk assessment is a statutory document and is applicable from 24th February 2022. It will be reviewed fortnightly after this time and may be updated to reflect any further guidance issued by the DfE. The contents reflects the main guidance documents listed below. Control measures within the risk assessment bring the residual risk rating to 'low'.

<p>Reducing Covid-19 transmission:</p> <p>for a child becoming unwell in the setting</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If a pupil displays Coronavirus symptoms [new, continuous cough or high temperature or a loss or change in sense of taste or smell] they will be isolated and sent home immediately, with parents directed to follow government and NHS guidance, including the DfE guidance to get tested • If the pupil subsequently test positive, they should inform school immediately. If they test negative, they may return to the setting upon providing proof of the negative result. • The library is the designated isolation room but will otherwise be used for other activities, such as group interventions. • A staff member working with the group containing a symptomatic child will use PPE and supervise the child in the isolation room and with the window open until they can safely leave school. • Government guidance will be followed to ensure the adequate cleaning of the room by the member of staff involved in the case. This will include disinfecting surfaces, appropriate disposal of any PPE used and washing hands. • Anyone else within the group does not need to go home unless they display symptoms. • A subsequent negative PCR test means that the pupil/adult can return to the setting. • Everyone who has contact with an unwell pupil/adult must wash their hands 	<p>Low</p>
<p>Reducing Covid-19 transmission:</p> <p>for a confirmed case of Covid-19</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If someone tests positive, they should follow DfE guidance and self-isolate from the date of the positive test or from the onset of symptoms (whichever comes first) <u>and then for 10 full days</u>. • You can stop self-isolating after 5 days if you do a LFD test on days 5 and 6 of your self-isolation period and both tests are negative <u>and</u> you did the tests on consecutive days <u>and</u> you do not have a high temperature. • If you do a rapid lateral flow test on day 6 and test positive, wait 24 hours before you do the next test. • If you have a high temperature after the 10 days, or are feeling unwell, keep self-isolating and seek medical advice. • All pupils (and fully-vaccinated adults) identified as a contact of someone with Covid-19 are no longer required to take LFD tests and should continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result. • The DfE's Contingency Framework requires schools to take 'extra action' if at least 5 pupils/staff, who are 'likely to have mixed closely, test positive for Covid-19 within a 10 day period'. In this event, the school will contact the DfE Helpline who will support the school in conducting a risk assessment to determine next steps. • The school will not release the names or details of those people with Coronavirus. • If a pupil is absent from school due to them testing positive for Covid-19, the school will provide remote learning for the duration of their absence if the child is well enough to engage with it. 	<p>Low</p>

	Control Measures	Residual Risk Rating
<p>Reducing Covid-19 transmission:</p> <p>at the start and end of the school day</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parents and visitors may not enter the school building • Parents may access the playground via the front and rear entrance but must not congregate or wait along the narrow path leading from the front pedestrian access gate. This area is clearly marked as a no waiting zone. • Only one parent of each child should enter the school site for the purpose of school drop off/pick up. • Parents should drop off/pick up children in the playground and leave the school site promptly • Parents are requested to observe Covid-19 rules at all times • All children enter their classroom immediately on arrival where they will be greeted by a member of staff • At home time, pupils will remain in the classroom and be dismissed one at a time to minimise congestion • All childcare provision will continue (morning supervision from 8.30am and after-school childcare). • School requests that any positive test results of pupils or members of their household are shared with school promptly • Drop-off is from 8.45-8.55am with collection at the normal time of 3.30pm. The extended drop-off is to provide a calm start to the day and is unrelated to Covid-19 risk. 	<p>Low</p>
<p>Reducing Covid-19 transmission:</p> <p>between home and school</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Anybody displaying symptoms should not to come to school as per government guidance • All staff and pupils to wash hands on arrival at and before leaving school • Any deliveries to school will require social distancing measures to be observed • Essential repairs will only take place in secure, cordoned off areas, with all hygiene measures respected • Children should bring in lunchbox/snack, water bottle and a coat, reading book and Home Communication Book. • Pupils should not bring bags. Schools will instead use a A4 plastic wallet (Years 3-6) or Book Bags (EY and KS1). • There will be no physical access to the school office. Instead all enquiries should be made via email and phone • PPE will be available as an emergency precaution for suspected cases • Staff will get in close proximity of pupils if their duty of care demands it eg; to administer first aid • Given the layout of the school and the deployment of staff within it, it is not appropriate to mandate the wearing of face coverings in any part of the school, although staff are supported to wear face coverings if they so choose. • Staff do not need to do anything other than normal personal hygiene and washing of clothes • DfE guidance states pupils' <i>'uniforms do not need to be cleaned any more often or differently than usual.'</i> • Staff and parents are no longer encouraged to engage with twice-weekly Lateral Flow Device (LFD) testing 	<p>Low</p>

	Control Measures	Residual Risk Rating
<p>Reducing Covid-19 transmission:</p> <p>by controlling movement around school</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The majority of restrictions relating to movement around school have been lifted. • Staff and pupils should not enter the office unless it is absolutely necessary • Messages between the office and classrooms to take place only via telephone/email, with electronic registers used to minimise contact. • Member of staff should continue to use the staffroom provided that safe distancing is observed. • Staff may choose to use their own cups, cutlery, plates and dishes and keep these washed and stored appropriately. • Staff are reminded to avoid close contact where possible • PE will take place both inside and outside • Classes to use own external doors to access the playground • Only one child per class/group to be authorised to use the toilet at any one time • Children reminded to wash hands for 20 seconds after each toilet visit • Whole school assemblies will continue this term, as will shared break and lunchtimes 	<p style="text-align: center;">Low</p>

	Control Measures	Residual Risk Rating
<p>Reducing Covid-19 transmission:</p> <p>at other times of the school day</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A clear and enhanced cleaning schedule is in place to include the daily cleaning of all rooms/areas used in school [including door handles, tables, chairs, light switches and any large structures/resources]. Lidded bins will be situated in each classroom for disposal of tissues • Cleaning 'stations' including alcohol (70%) wipes, disinfectant spray and hand sanitiser will be positioned in each classroom and key areas around school with regularly used surfaces/items cleaned between uses. • A designated sink is available to each class • Pupils will wash hands on arrival to and before departing school and before and after activities, including eating • Children will be regularly reminded to 'catch, bin and kill' sneezes and coughs • Where children cannot independently manage their own hygiene, they will be supported to do so by an adult. PPE should be used by staff when involved in 'intimate care' of pupils. • Teachers should continue marking work as per school policy and pupils can access reading books from a class set • All staff will continue working across different groups and classes within the school although they will be timetabled to minimise this where possible. • Interventions (individual and group) will continue and may include children from different groups. Communal learning spaces are timetabled to avoid clashes. • Internal doors will be open where possible to aid ventilation and minimise contact with handles. Carbon Dioxide monitors are in place in all classrooms and work areas so that staff can ensure adequate ventilation. • DfE advise that windows should be opened where possible but not to compromise thermal comfort and after each school day for an hour to allow thorough ventilation of school. • There are no restrictions that limit the school's scope to create learning environments to reflect our curriculum themes and so classrooms should once again be designed with this in mind. • Children continue to be provided with their own individual equipment eg; pens, pencils • Outdoor learning is promoted at every opportunity. • External professionals eg; music tutors, and volunteers will continue their roles in school whilst adhering to the school's risk assessment. • Break and lunchtime will continue to be mixed 	<p style="text-align: center;">Low</p>

<p>Reducing Covid-19 transmission:</p> <p>for vulnerable pupils and those with SEN</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All interventions and 1:1 support will continue to take place in classrooms and communal learning spaces • Intervention spaces will be cleaned at the end of each session by the member of staff in charge of the group. • The government advises any child who meets the criteria of being extremely clinically vulnerable '<i>can return to their educational settings.</i>' Unless they have been advised specifically by their GP to stay off school. 	<p>Low</p>
